It is my pleasure to present another President's Report for 2015/2016.

It has been a period of significant change and Deaf Victoria has used this opportunity to take stock and evaluate our direction in this

changing climate. The inception of the NDIS will have an impact on how we position ourselves for the Deaf and Hard of hearing communities and continue to do individual and systematic advocacy. How we also provide information dissemination is crucial too, as the community becomes more technology savvy and e-communication becomes the norm.

Deaf Victoria said farewell to two staff members in early 2016. Melissa Lowrie was successful in obtaining a position as DARU Co-ordinator (Disability Advocacy Resource Unit) for Victorian Council of Social Services. Melissa has given much of her time and with her board, helped Deaf Victoria to grow into the strong position it is today. Melanie Merhi, our administration officer also left Deaf Victoria. Melanie was responsible for the administrative side of Deaf Victoria, as well as running Deaf Deaf World workshops, Deaf Market and supporting Deaf Youth Victoria. Both Melissa and Melanie kept Deaf Victoria running smoothly and we thank them for their work and commitment, and wish them the best in their future endeavours.

Deaf Victoria was pleased to announce the appointment of Jen Blyth. She brings many skills as an advocate and communicator and it has been a smooth and successful transition. The focus has shifted to improving on current services and increasing our use of social media to engage with our community. Using Facebook, Instagram and Twitter, Jen with the support of the board has utilized weekly updates, radio advocacy and the various workshops she has attended to engage with our members and community.

Rather than advertise for an administration person, Deaf Victoria focused on small projects. Our first project was to do an overhaul on our resources which were outdated and desperately in need of a revamp. To this end, we advertised for a fixed term Resource Officer and Jessica Moody filled this position. Her role includes updating the Deaf Deaf World resources amongst others.

The biggest event for Deaf Victoria was undoubtedly the Deaf Mental Health Conference held in November. Held over two days and with significant sponsorship and in-kind support, we were able to deliver a top quality event that catered for

grassroots deaf to professionals. Thank you to the sub-committee of Melissa Lowrie, Gary Kerridge, Dean Barton-Smith, Karli Dettman and Sandra Spadea for their involvement in organizing this wonderful conference.

Deaf Victoria continues to partner with and provide support to other individuals and organisations. We are also grateful for their support.
